MONDAY, NOVEMBER 14, 1994

The Board of Canvassers met at 10:00 a.m., on Monday, November 14, 1994, in Room No. 103 of the Monongalia County Courthouse and began by counting the number of challenged ballot envelopes received from each precinct at which time the County Clerk was directed to prepare a synopsis of the two hundred forty one (241) challenged ballots cast.

The Board of Canvassers accepted eight (8) absentee ballots and three (3) spoiled ballots as received from the Circuit Clerk's Office.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Pyles, seconded by Commissioner Merow, and unanimously carried, to refer the eight (8) absentee ballots and three (3) spoiled ballots received from the Circuit Clerk's Office to the County Clerk for preparation of a synopsis.

The Board of Canvassers accepted ten (10) absentee ballots, one (1) absentee ballot from Precinct Ten and nine (9) absentee ballots from Precinct Sixty-One, as received from the returned election supplies, that were not counted, but were not challenged.

The Board of Canvassers accepted three (3) challenged ballots from Precinct Twenty as received from the returned election supplies. These three (3) ballots are included in the total number of challenged ballots cast, directed to the County Clerk for synopsis.

The Board of Canvassers received a note on the back of a sample ballot from the returned election supplies from Precinct Seventy-Five, attesting to the fact that the Poll Clerks forgot to sign Ballots one (1) through sixty-nine (69).

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Martin, seconded by Commissioner Merow, and unanimously carried, to accept Ballots one (1) through sixty-nine (69) from Precinct Seventy-Five having received an affidavit from the Poll Workers of that Precinct stating that the Poll Clerks forgot to sign those Ballots.

In accordance with West Virginia State Code 3-4A-28(4), the Board of Canvassers proceeded to choose at least five (5) percent, being four (4) of the precincts, at random by the drawing of precinct numbers, and ballots were then manually counted. The following precincts were selected.

Precinct 6
Precinct 22
Precinct 40
Precinct 49

The Board of Canvassers proceeded to compare the Polls Tickets of each precinct to the Statements of Ballots Used as well as the Summary Report generated by the Optical Scanner displaying numbers of ballots cast.

The Board of Canvassers recessed at 12:15 p.m. until 2:30 p.m.

The Board of Canvassers reconvened at 2:30 p.m. to continue to compare the Polls Tickets of each precinct to the Statements of Ballots Used as well as the Summary Report generated by the Optical Scanner displaying numbers of ballots cast. After finding no discrepancies, ballots were then sealed into envelopes identified by precinct number with the Board of Canvassers' signatures attached thereto.

The Board of Canvassers also continued to manually count the four (4) precincts randomly selected. The votes were then tallied and each verified to the Summary Report generated by the Optical Scanner.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Martin, seconded by Commissioner Pyles, and unanimously carried, to refer the ten (10) absentee ballots and the two hundred forty-one (241) challenged ballots to the County Clerk for preparation of a synopsis.

The Board of Canvassers met at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, November 17, 1994, to review the challenged and absentee ballots cast in the November 8, 1994, General Election for the purpose of determining which ballots will be allowed and disallowed.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Pyles, seconded by Commissioner Merow, and unanimously carried, to allow six (6) absentee ballots, as received from the Circuit Clerk's Office.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Pyles, seconded by Commissioner Merow, and unanimously carried, recognizing the receipt of three (3) spoiled ballots, from the Circuit Clerk's Office, which were disallowed; one (1) ballot was not received by addressee; and two (2) ballots were due to the individuals voting at their precincts.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Pyles, seconded by Commissioner Merow, and unanimously carried, to allow one (1) absentee ballot challenged from Precinct Seventy-Two, as received from the Circuit Clerk's Office.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Pyles, seconded by Commissioner Merow, and unanimously carried, to allow one (1) absentee ballot from Precinct Twenty-Four, as received from the Circuit Clerk's Office.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Pyles, seconded by Commissioner Merow, and unanimously carried, to allow ten (10) absentee ballots, which were properly post marked.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Merow, seconded by Commissioner Pyles, and unanimously carried, to allow two (2) challenged ballots of voters who voted in the wrong precinct. Said precincts were in the same building.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Merow, seconded by Commissioner Pyles, and unanimously carried, to allow thirty-five (35) challenged ballots of voters who moved in excess of thirty (30) days of the election.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Pyles, seconded by Commissioner Merow, and unanimously carried, to disallow twenty-one (21) challenged ballots of voters determined to be not registered.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Pyles, seconded by Commissioner Merow, and unanimously carried, to allow four (4) challenged ballots of voters who voted in the wrong precinct, due to some confusion based on realignment.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Merow, seconded by Commissioner Pyles, and unanimously carried, to allow three (3) challenged ballots of voters who voted in the wrong precinct, and in different senatorial districts.

County Clerk Thelma J. Gibson stated that the three (3) challenged ballots of voters who voted in the wrong precinct, and in different senatorial districts, will need to be opened, shuffled, and the senatorial vote will be blocked out.

The amount of challenged ballots received will be reduced by one (1) when it was learned that one (1) challenged ballot envelope was empty.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Pyles, seconded by Commissioner Merow, and unanimously carried, to allow one (1) absentee ballot, which was challenged, due to said ballot being sent to the wrong precinct by the Circuit Clerk.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Merow, seconded by Commissioner Pyles, and unanimously carried, to allow two (2) challenged ballots of voters whose residential address of the voters did not match precisely with their voter registration card.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Pyles, seconded by Commissioner Merow, and unanimously carried, to allow eleven (11) challenged ballots of voters of which poll workers overlooked in the books.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Pyles, seconded by Commissioner Merow, and unanimously carried, to allow twenty-six (26) challenged ballots of voters who voted in the wrong precinct.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Merow, seconded by Commissioner Pyles, and unanimously carried, to allow nine (9) challenged ballots of voters who voted in the wrong precinct, who moved within thirty (3) days of the election and different senatorial districts.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Pyles, seconded by Commissioner Merow, and unanimously carried, to allow ninety-two (92) challenged ballots of poll workers in the same senatorial district.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Merow, seconded by Commissioner Pyles, and unanimously carried, to allow thirty-three (33) challenged ballots of poll workers in different senatorial districts.

A motion was duly made by Commissioner Merow, seconded by Commissioner Pyles, and unanimously carried, to allow one (1) ballot of a female voter, who changed her name.

The Board of Canvassers proceeded to open and place face down the Challenged and Absentee ballots to be tabulated by the Optical Scanner.

Following are the total allowed and disallowed Challenged and Absentee votes cast by all precincts:



